


The results of the teaching and learning evaluation are expected to provide valuable feedback for the teaching team to maintain and continuously enhance the quality of education.














Student Satisfaction Index (SSI) Course in Semester 1





Student Satisfaction Index (SSI) Course in Semester III








Student Satisfaction Index (SSI) Course in Semester V






Based on the top 10 IKM (Student Satisfaction Index) scores of lecturers, two components frequently appearing as the lowest on average were identified:

a. Availability of Handouts or Course Materials Corresponding to the Delivered Content

The availability of handouts or course materials that align with the subjects taught at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine (FVM) is often inadequate. This may be due to several factors, including a lack of coordination between lecturers and teaching staff, resulting in course materials not being updated or aligned with the

latest syllabus. There may also be budgetary constraints or limited resources for printing and distributing quality handouts, a reliance on traditional teaching methods such as lectures that lead students to undervalue the importance of course materials, a lack of written materials accessible to students, and a lack of initiative among lecturers to create comprehensive handouts that align with the course content. Additionally, there may be an absence or inadequacy of a centralised digital platform for downloading and accessing course materials.

To address these root causes, the following improvements can be made: enhancing coordination by forming a curriculum coordination team composed of lecturers and teaching staff to ensure that course materials are always up-to-date and aligned with the syllabus. Improving communication through regular meetings to discuss course content and teaching material needs is also necessary. The next step involves developing resources by allocating a specific budget for the development and printing of course materials, as well as leveraging grants or partnerships with publishers to provide high-quality teaching materials. The faculty can also encourage teaching innovation by organising training sessions for lecturers on the importance of and methods for creating effective handouts and encouraging lecturers to use digital teaching materials such as e-books, slide presentations, and educational videos. For this purpose, the faculty can establish a centralised digital platform by developing or utilising a Learning Management System (LMS) like Moodle or Google Classroom, where lecturers can upload course materials accessible to students at any time. This system can be integrated with the digital library so that students can easily access additional references. To monitor the implementation of these methods, the faculty should conduct regular surveys among students to assess the availability and quality of course materials and use student feedback for targeted improvements. Additionally, the faculty can enhance the role of the library by strengthening its role in providing relevant and up-to-date course materials and offering online access to course materials through the library portal.

Implementation of Improvement Measures by the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine:

1) Development of Course Content:

The Faculty of Veterinary Medicine (FVM) can establish a content development team comprising lecturers and subject matter experts to create handouts that are aligned with each course. This team can collaborate with the educational technology centre to ensure that digital course materials are easily accessible

2) Training and Development of Lecturers:

Training and development for lecturers can be provided through workshops and training sessions on creating effective teaching materials and using technology in instruction. Additionally, FVM can encourage lecturers to engage in research and development of evidence-based teaching materials.

3) Enhancement of Infrastructure:

FVM can enhance the information technology facilities on campus, such as providing fast internet connections and adequate computer equipment. Moreover, the faculty can offer comfortable study spaces equipped with access to digital teaching materials.

4) Collaboration with Industry:

Building partnerships with relevant industries can help acquire upto-date and relevant teaching materials. FVM can invite industry practitioners to deliver guest lectures or workshops that can broaden students' perspectives

By implementing these improvement measures, FVM can enhance the availability and quality of teaching materials, thereby making the learning process more effective and efficient.

b. The Delivery of Material in English

The lack of material delivery in English at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine may be caused by several factors, including limited English proficiency among lecturers, insufficient materials and learning resources in English, and minimal training and professional development. Many lecturers may not have adequate English skills to teach effectively in that language. This could be due to lecturers lacking access and opportunities for continuous and quality English language training, as well as limited resources such as textbooks, online courses, and other teaching materials. Another contributing factor could be the lack of incentives for lecturers to develop their English skills or to teach in English.

Based on the root of the problem, the the recommended improvement steps are as implementing intensive english training programs to provide intensive english language training for lecturers, including languange courses and teaching training in english. International collaboration to encourage international partnerships with institutions to enhance English proficiency through faculty and student exchanges, as well as collaborative programs. The faculty can also provide incentives to lecturers who develop their English language skills and teach in English, such as awards, bonuses, or career development opportunities. To monitor progress, the faculty should conduct regular evaluations and monitoring of lecturers' English proficiency and the effectiveness of teaching in English, and follow up with necessary improvements. Additionally, the faculty can employ teaching assistants or tutors proficient in English to assist in material delivery and provide support to lecturers.

The implementation of these improvement steps by the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine is as follows:

1) English Proficiency Audit for Lecturers

Conduct an audit to identify the english proficiency of lecturers and determine specific training needs.

2) Forming a Content Development Team

Form a team responsible for developing and reviewing teaching materials in english.

3) Designing a Structured Training Programme

Design a structured and continuous english training program for lecturers.

4) Organising Regular Workshops and Seminars

Hold regular workshops and seminars on teaching methods in english and the use of supporting technologies.

With these steps, the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine can address the lack of material delivery in English and enhance the quality of education provided to students.

CHAPTER 3 SUGGESTIONS AND FEEDBACK

The following feedback was obtained from the recap and evaluation for the Odd Semester of the Academic Year 2021/2022:

- Lectures and practical sessions would be more effective if conducted in person.
- Transparency of grades for both lectures and practicals.
- Introduction of varied teaching methods in online lectures.
- Reference books: modules or learning materials.
- Lectures are not always conducted according to the schedule, with many replacement classes.

CHAPTER 4 CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Based on the results of the Student Satisfaction Index evaluation related to the teaching and learning process for the odd semester of the 2021/2022 academic year, the following conclusions can be drawn:

- 1. The recapitulation of the evaluation results for teaching and learning in the even semester on the components of course implementation, practical courses, facilities (reading rooms), and lecturer assessments shows that 45% 55% received an "Excellent" rating, 30% 40% received a "Good" rating, and 25% 30% received a "Satisfactory" rating.
- In the course evaluation component, the three courses with the highest IKM scores are: Veterinary Immunology, Biomolecular Analysis Techniques, and Poultry Planning and Management.
- 3. In the practical evaluation component, the three practicals with the highest IKM scores are: Special Surgery Practicum, Anatomical Pathology Practicum, and Clinical Pathology Practicum.
- 4. The components of the Student Satisfaction Index with lower scores are related to the availability of handouts or course materials that match the content provided and the delivery of material in English. It is hoped that this will become a focus for improvement to enhance the effectiveness of the Teaching and Learning Process and the Student Satisfaction Index.
