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CHAPTER 1 INTRODUCTION

1.1. Background

Higher education institutions serve as a platform for shaping young generations who are intelligent, critical, creative, innovative, scientifically minded, knowledgeable, virtuous, moral, ethical, and have excellent character to face the challenges and complexities of the outside world. Based on Rector's Regulation of Universitas Brawijaya No. 76 of 2022 concerning Risk-Based Quality Standards, Rector's Regulation of Universitas Brawijaya No. 78 of 2022 concerning the Internal Quality Assurance System Manual, and Rector's Regulation of Universitas Brawijaya No. 77 of 2022, to realise quality and internationally standardised higher education management, it is necessary to establish risk-based internal quality assurance within Universitas Brawijaya.

To achieve this goal, effective and efficient steps and efforts by lecturers are required, which include: 1) preparing course contracts to determine the expected learning outcomes in accordance with higher education standards, 2) delivering lectures to transfer knowledge and technology, 3) assigning group work to train collaboration, environmental awareness, responsibility, and discipline, 4) encouraging class discussions to receive feedback and stimulate student curiosity, developing critical thinking, and the courage to express responsible opinions in accordance with proper principles, and 5) providing field-based learning through direct involvement in fieldwork and laboratory activities.

The success of the learning programme can be assessed through evaluations. The teaching and learning process evaluation is conducted from and for the students. One form of evaluation from students is through a questionnaire that assesses the extent of student satisfaction with the teaching and learning process. The questionnaire results are then analysed by the quality assurance unit and subsequently presented at the RPS (Course Unit Plan) preparation workshop in the following semester. The PBM (Teaching and Learning Process) analysis results include evaluations of courses and lecturers based on their performance, which helps identify which courses and lecturers require improvement. The PBM evaluation results are expected to provide input for the teaching team to maintain and continuously enhance the quality of education.

The preparation of the PBM Evaluation Report is conducted at the end of each semester through multi-unit coordination meetings under FKH UB (Faculty of Veterinary Medicine, Universitas Brawijaya), involving elements of GJM (Quality Assurance Team), UJM (Internal Quality Assurance Unit), and UPKH (Quality Assurance Unit). The preparation of the PBM Evaluation Report for the Even Semester of 2022-2023 was carried out in August 2023. The preparation of the PBM Evaluation Report is also supported by the role of KPS (Head of Study Programme), the academic section of FKH UB, lecturers, and administrative staff. The PBM evaluation report will then be presented at the RPS Preparation Workshop in the Odd Semester of 2023-2024.




Figure 2.3.1 Results of the Infrastructure Questionnaire Evaluation for the Even Semester

Based on the top 10 IKM scores for lecturers, two of the lowest components frequently appear in the average scores of lecturers. These components are:

a. Providing Feedback on Midterms/Quizzes

The lack of feedback on midterms/quizzes at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine may be due to the absence of a structured system for providing constructive and timely feedback to students. Several factors contributing to this issue include: a lack of time and workload constraints for lecturers, preventing them from providing detailed and timely feedback. The lack of systematisation related to the absence of standard procedures for effective and structured feedback after midterms/quizzes could also be a reason for low scores in this component. Additionally, limitations in establishing effective communication between lecturers

and students regarding the importance of feedback may hinder the provision of responses after midterms/quizzes. Insufficient training for lecturers on how to give constructive and useful feedback may also be a contributing factor to the low level of feedback on midterms/quizzes at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine.

Based on these root issues, several improvement steps can be undertaken. Firstly, enhancing the systematic provision of feedback by establishing standard procedures for delivering feedback, including setting a maximum timeframe for providing feedback after midterms/quizzes, or by using feedback templates that assist lecturers in giving constructive and specific comments related to student performance. Another step that can be taken is offering training for lecturers, such as organising workshops or training sessions on effective feedback techniques, and providing guidance on how to deliver feedback that is constructive and motivates students to improve their academic performance. Reducing the workload of lecturers can also be an improvement measure; this can be achieved by considering the redistribution of workload or the addition of teaching assistants to help with administrative Semester Credit Units, allowing lecturers more time to focus on providing feedback. Additionally, the faculty can use technology to automate the assessment of the objective parts of midterms/quizzes, enabling lecturers to concentrate more on qualitative feedback. Another crucial improvement measure is strengthening communication with students. This can be done by informing students about the importance of feedback and how to use it for improvement, and by holding special sessions after midterms/quizzes where lecturers explain the results generally and provide tips for improvement.

The Faculty of Veterinary Medicine can implement these improvement measures as follows:

1) Developing Standard Procedures

The Faculty of Veterinary Medicine (FVM) can develop standard procedures to ensure that feedback is provided within a specified timeframe after midterms/quizzes. These procedures may include the use of feedback templates that help lecturers give specific and helpful comments.

2) Conducting Training for Lecturers

FVM can organise training sessions for lecturers to enhance their skills in providing constructive feedback. This training should cover effective feedback techniques, how to deliver criticism constructively, and ways to motivate students through feedback.

3) Increasing the Number of Teaching Assistants

To reduce lecturers' workload, FKH might consider adding teaching assistants or utilising technology to assist with assessments. For example, the objective parts of midterms/quizzes could be assessed automatically, allowing lecturers to focus more on the qualitative aspects of feedback

4) Strengthening Communication with Students

FVM should strengthen communication with students regarding the importance of feedback. This can be done through special sessions after midterms/quizzes where lecturers explain the results in general and provide improvement tips. In this way, students will better understand and appreciate the value of the feedback they receive.

By implementing these improvement measures, FKH can enhance the effectiveness and efficiency of feedback delivery, ultimately improving the quality of learning and students' academic performance.

b. Provision of Information on Course Materials in the Form of Books, Journals, or Electronic Documents Referenced

The lack of information provision at the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine may be due to several factors, including a lack of integrated information systems, ineffective coordination among lecturers, and limited time or resources available to lecturers. The absence of an integrated information system is related to the lack of a cohesive system for managing and distributing information about course materials to lecturers and students. Ineffective coordination among lecturers regarding the course materials used may be due to lecturers' limited time to hold meetings and discussions. Additionally, differences in teaching styles and personal preferences may lead to discrepancies in the selection of course materials and the manner of information delivery. The inadequate provision of course materials may also result from lecturers having limited time and resources to search for, organize, and distribute information about course materials to students.

Based on the root of the problem, a recommended improvement is the development of an integrated information system that can be used by lecturers to upload and distribute information regarding course materials to students. This system could be an e-learning platform or an easily accessible academic portal. To improve coordination among lecturers, regular meetings can be held to discuss and agree on the course materials to be used. This will ensure consistency in the information provided to students. Additionally, lecturers can also take advantage of technology for collaboration by using online platforms such as Google Classroom,

Microsoft Teams, or other e-learning platforms that allow for easy sharing of teaching materials and communication.

The implementation of improvement steps that can be carried out by the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine is as follows:

1) Audit and Initial Evaluation

Conduct an initial audit to identify specific needs and issues related to the delivery of course materials.

2) Appointment of Course Coordinators

Appoint a course coordinator for each course who will be responsible for coordinating course materials and ensuring consistent delivery of information. This coordinator is tasked with arranging faculty meetings, preparing syllabi, and coordinating the teaching materials to be used.

3) Development or Improvement of Integrated Information Systems

Build or enhance integrated information systems to manage and distribute information regarding course materials. This system could be an academic portal or an e-learning platform that facilitates faculty in uploading teaching materials and students in accessing them.

4) Provision of Access to Learning Resources

Provide better access to libraries, online journals, and other electronic resources. This involves purchasing licenses for international journals, expanding library collections, or collaborating with other institutions.

5) Task Distribution and Collaboration Among Faculty

Encourage task distribution among faculty in terms of preparing and delivering teaching materials. Faculty members can collaborate in creating teaching content, thereby reducing individual workload.

6) Utilisation of Teaching Assistants or Tutors

Employ teaching assistants or tutors proficient in English to help in delivering material and providing support to faculty. Teaching assistants can assist in preparing materials, selecting appropriate terminology, and using English more effectively in teaching.

7) Periodic Evaluation and Adjustment

Conduct periodic evaluations of the effectiveness of the measures taken and make necessary adjustments based on feedback from faculty and students.

With these steps, the Faculty of Veterinary Medicine can address the lack of information about course materials and improve the quality of teaching and learning for students.

CHAPTER 3: RECOMMENDATIONS AND SUGGESTIONS

- 1. The presentation of the material should not be too fast, and a greater variety of teaching methods should be employed to prevent students from becoming bored and to ensure better understanding.
- 2. The scheduling of guest lectures should be improved, as they often clash with practical sessions, preventing students from benefiting from the knowledge of the guest speakers.
- 3. Quizzes and case study discussions should be conducted regularly.
- 4. The material should ideally be presented directly, not solely through discussions.
- 5. Future examinations should preferably be in a paper-based format.
- 6. Lecturers are requested to adhere to the lecture schedule outlined in the course contract, and the PowerPoint materials should be provided promptly after the lectures or before the exams, allowing students to study effectively.
- 7. Pre-tests and post-tests should be used as a guide for midterm or final exam questions.
- 8. There are instances where exam questions differ from what was explained, and the difficulty level of exam questions, such as calculation problems, should be considered.
- 9. Individual assessment within case study assignments is necessary, as the distribution of work among group members is sometimes uneven.

CHAPTER 4: CONCLUSION

Based on the evaluation results of the Student Satisfaction Index (SSI) related to the Teaching and Learning Process (TLP) for the even semester of the 2022/2023 academic year, the following conclusions can be drawn:

- 1. The recapitulation of the teaching and learning evaluation results for the even semester, encompassing course implementation, practical sessions, infrastructure (reading rooms), and lecturer assessment, indicates that 45% 55% received a "very good" rating, 30% 40% received a "good" rating, and 25% 30% received a "satisfactory" rating.
- 2. In the course of the evaluation component, the three courses with the highest SSI scores are: Veterinary Public Health and One Health, Veterinary Parasitic Diseases, and Aquatic Animal Health Management and Molecular Analysis Techniques.
- 3. In the practical session of the evaluation component, the three practical sessions with the highest SSI scores are: Veterinary General Surgery, Experimental Animal Science, and Veterinary Parasitic Diseases.
- 4. The SSI components that scored lower across all elements include the explanation of the course agenda, feedback on midterm exams/quizzes, and the availability of handouts or course materials that correspond with the lectures. These areas are identified as key focuses for improvement to enhance the success of the TLP and SSI scores.
